A man of many talents, he could fix anything. He loved to work with his hands, whether he was working on his yard, wood-working or doing construction work for others. He was never happier than when he was helping, taking care of people and offering advice. If there was a crisis, he would make everything right. He loved to look out for people, especially family and could sense whenever there was anything wrong. His involvement in the community was extensive. He was proud to offer his leadership and resources. He was honoured by the Canadian Community Newspaper Association (Silver Quill Award, prestigious Life Time Membership Award, former director); Atlantic Community Newspaper Association (Past President); Pictou County Chamber of Commerce (Business Person of The Year, Business of the Year), International Society of Weekly Newspaper Editors (current director); Pictou Academy Education Foundation Board of Directors; his past involvement was lengthy including recreation, education, health and religion and community economic development. He was predeceased by his parents George and Nonie (Wallace) Murray.
