

D Andrew Eisenhower

Born in Lunenburg, NS in 1923 Andrew attended school at Lunenburg Academy and later Kings Collegiate School in Windsor, NS and graduated from the Nova Scotia Technical College. Following a period with the Grenfell Mission on their coastal freighter he began his professional career in London, Ontario. In 1947 he co-founded the Atlantic Bridge Company of Lunenburg, which is now the ABCO Group of Companies

He lent his engineering and leadership skills to numerous provincial and national organizations such as the boards of the Maritime Life Assurance, Maritime Tel and Tel, and Chair of the Technical University of Nova Scotia. He particularly enjoyed his association with the National Research Council and the Dalhousie University Business School.

Andrew has been honoured with a Doctor of Divinity by the Atlantic School of Theology in 1994 and a Doctor of Laws by Dalhousie University in 2009. He was honoured by his induction into the Junior Achievement Nova Scotia Business Hall of Fame and has been recognized as a Life Member of the Association of Professional Engineers of Nova Scotia; and was a Fellow of the Canadian Society of Mechanical Engineering, the Engineering Institute of Canada and the Canadian Academy of Engineering.

He was interested and involved in the affairs and organizations of the town of Lunenburg, was a founder of the original Fisheries Museum and particularly enjoyed his association with the Curling Club, Golf Club, and the local Royal Canadian Legion.

Always had a strong affiliation to St. John's Anglican Church in Lunenburg and co-chaired the restoration of the church after it was destroyed by fire on Nov 1, 2001. He chaired a campaign at the Atlantic School of Theology and was a member of the fundraising committee for the Anglican Church of Canada.

Andrew was a kind and loving person, devoted to his wife, children and grandchildren, and very much loved in return. He was a loyal friend to all he met and will be greatly missed by his extended family and wide circle of friends.
